Welcome to The Start of the Spring Elections

February has been a transition period for Burnett County Dems as we move toward the Spring Elections on April 7th and the Fall elections and events seriously move into our radar for planning purposes.

We started off the month at our monthly meeting with Devin Remiker, WisDems chair, talking to us about how CD-7 and northwestern Wisconsin fits into the WisDems' agenda. While it was a promising talk, we are going to have to do some legwork to turn CD-7 Blue and especially Assembly District-75, but I believe, we have some very strong candidates who can do this.

You will have a chance to meet the candidates in April at our Dueholm Dinner, at Chateau St. Croix, on April 19th starting at 1:00 pm. Here you will be able to listen to the candidates speak, talk with them one-on-one and sign their nomination papers. We have confirmed the following candidates are attending Ginger Murrey, Chris Armstrong, and Fred Clark all for CD-7; Charly Ray State Senate

District 25; and Keith Mogel State Assembly District 75 (more info below). All of the Gubernatorial candidates have been invited as well, and as they confirm they will be placed in the April newsletter. Now is not the time to just grumble into your coffee while reading the morning news, now it is the time to join us and our county party to make resolutions that come from our area and will speak to our needs. I and hopefully 10 other delegates will follow them through the entire process into the CD-7 conference, and on to State to ensure your voice is heard.

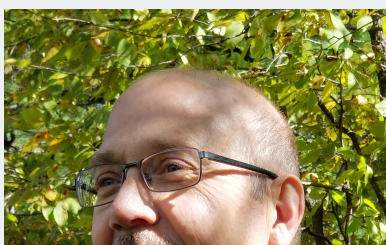
No Kings Day
